

- Loving the community and the challenge of solving square dance "puzzles", because square dancing is the best kind of puzzle!




I've danced with all three of them, and they are so much fun to dance with. They are solo dancers, so if you see them at a dance, please ask them to dance or invite them into your square.





ILA WILLIAMS MEMORIAL AWARD

Mount Baker Council established the Ila Williams Memorial Award in 2007 in memory of Ila Williams, who was an avid square dancer, and Mount Baker Council officer, for all her outstanding efforts and many contributions to the promotion of square dancing in Snohomish County and the State of Washington.

Criteria for Selection:

- The Ila Williams Memorial Award shall be presented at the Mount Baker Council Spring Festival Dance each year to a Mount Baker Council area dancer (individual, couple, caller or cuer) who has done an outstanding job of promoting square dancing or round dancing in the Mount Baker Council area.
- The Award is to honor a person or couple for the time and effort they have devoted to our hobby.
- The current holder shall retain the award for one year and shall select the following year's recipient, outside their own club, and present the award to the new recipients at the next Mount Baker Council Spring Festival Dance.

Each club or individual may send a nomination to the current recipient who is serving as the current year's Chair. This nomination should be accompanied with a resume (write-up) of the nominee's accomplishments. Nominations aid in choosing a recipient and do not mean they must be chosen from those nominations. The current holder may utilize any method they choose in selecting the recipient.

Those who have submitted a resume previously and your nominee did not get chosen, please re-submit that resume and add any current activities to update your nomination.







Samena Squares are hosting the next council dance, then the Whirlybirds, then the Happy Hoppers.

Recording Secretary: Sammi Fredenburg, 360 359-2304 Reminder that I need both paper AND digital reports from each club. It helps a lot if you have the digital report submitted to me prior to the meeting. And I need to know who your club delegates are. If you are a substitute delegate for your club, indicate so on the sign-in sheet. I will base my agenda distribution on who the delegates are.

Treasurer: Tom Corning, 949.228.0719, tomcorning@comcast.net Treasurer's report attached at the end of this report. Bills were itemized and paid..

Motion to pay bills, Brooks moved Melody seconded, passed. Eighteen-month CD at Mechanics Bank was rolled over into a 2-month CD, \$5.58 in interest. We will evaluate in the next few months on the best place for it to be going. 1099's for those paid greater than \$600 by your club for services performed need to be submitted to the state. Have callers/cuers fill out a W9. Tom Corning has the forms on order and the details. They need to be distributed by January 31st, and due to state by February 15th. Brooks mentioned that in past years when Marsha Sullivan as Treasurer at State Federation has offered to help with submission of 1099's, **Motion made and seconded to accept the Treasurer's Report, passed.**

Council Dances: Samena Squares reported that they were passing out flyers and tickets today for the Spring Council Dance. All clubs were encouraged to start selling these tickets as soon as possible.

Item of note:

- The Spring Council dance will be held May 30th, 2026 at Northshore Senior Center in Bothell, beginning at 2pm and ending at 5pm. This is corrected information, different from what was recently shared over email.
- Randy and Marie Preskitt will be cuing rounds starting at 2pm. Brett Kappeman will be calling Mainstream squares. Dave Harry will be calling a separate student level mainstream dance. The dance will also include a tumble-weed dance led by the Shooting Stars and Rob Sax.
- Pricing is as follows:

Ticket Type	In Advance	At the Door
Adult	\$15	\$18
Youth (18 and younger)	\$10	\$12
Family (2 adults and children under 18)	\$40	\$50

Please indicate which type of ticket is being sold by putting an "X" on the ticket next to the correct type. Also keep a record of how many of each type of tickets your club sells on page 2 of the instruction sheet. This information will be helpful in our accounting.

As part of Samena's presentation of tickets and flyers, Shawna requested a definition of "Student" since Samena's had been informed that student tickets were free and would be funded by the Mt. Baker Council. After much discussion with varying opinions and uncertainty of the meaning of records, **Shawna motioned that active students, defined as anyone who is involved with lessons at the time of the 2026 Spring Council Dance, will be provided with a free ticket which will be fully funded by the Mt. Baker Council. The motion was seconded from a delegate on the floor and, after additional discussions, passed.**

Thank you to delegates who mentioned the following:

- This decision for Mt. Baker Council to fund the active student tickets is for the 2026 Spring Council dance only. Discussion to decide a future course of direction in the handling of student tickets will be addressed at a future Mt. Baker Council meeting.

Sellers of tickets will also need to track both youth and adult student tickets. Please keep a list of how many youth and adult student tickets are handed out in the "Active MBC Students (Free)" box so proper funding is correctly recorded for Mt. Baker Council.

Samena Squares also mentioned that all mainstream clubs were provided with 20 tickets each and A-Blast and round clubs were each provided 10 tickets each. Larry of Happy Round club returned his club tickets since he was aware that all Happy Round members were also mainstream members and able to buy tickets within the mainstream clubs. Beverly Veenstra mentioned that if any club needs more tickets they are welcome to contact her for additional tickets. Her email contact for 2026 Council dance tickets is small.wing6337@fastmail.com.

Just to reiterate: free student tickets will only be for the two clubs that will be still holding lessons in May.

A late correction was realized on January 8th, 2026. Randy and Marie Preskitt will be starting pre-rounds at 2pm for **a half-hour**. Brett Kappenman will start calling squares at 2:30pm. Mainstream and round dances will alternate as usual for the majority of the Spring Council Dance.

- **Motion made by Shawna Blood and Beverly Veenstra that all active square dance students get into the Spring Council Dance for free, reimbursed by the Council. Melody seconded. If going to be a longer term venture, we need to consider creating a policy. Voted, passed.**
Whirlybirds do not have a report on the Fall dance.

Brooks gave verbal report on October 4th Council Dance. When date was set, no other clubs had dances on that date. That changed as time went by. Also, ticket sales were hard to account for as not all the dollars or tickets were returned. Each club is encouraged to make someone responsible for the sale of the tickets out of courtesy to the host club. 100 tickets sold, 31 at the door, 16 separately for the No Experience Hall. \$1825 was generated in sales. 1723.51 in expenses, net income was 101.39, \$50.80 profit to club after reimbursing the Council. Shooting Stars did all the refreshments, they raised \$230. Recommend that those selling the tickets are marked the sale price option so the host club will know what to expect in revenue. Good basket raffle. 50/50 did not generate very much money. Sewing goods sales were good. This income far outweighed the ticket sales. Only 20 tickets sold and not used. Hosting club members paid for admission. Dave recommended that a policy put in place that when tickets are distributed, clubs are financially responsible to return either the unsold tickets and money collected, We used to have envelopes on who the tickets were distributed to. Melody asked reimbursement rate on the tickets. Not sure.
